


AVOID

using free, public Wi-Fi




USE

a personal hotspot




DISABLE

or peer-to-peer devices



A Virtual Private Network connection is essential for maintaining full end-to-end encryption when connecting to a remote computer.




For enhanced security use

2FA

Two-Factor Authentication (2FA) is a security process in which the user provides two different authentication factors to better protect both the user's credentials and the resources the user can access.



NEVER

reuse a password

Cybercriminals keep dictionary lists of the most commonly used passwords. They also know that if they are successful in breaching a single account, they will often be able to access multiple accounts for the same person due to the high frequency of password reuse.
